In this newly created position, Benda will focus primarily on supporting the \$11 million <u>"Winning Streak for West Michigan" expansion</u> campaign for the Meijer Sports Complex and on overall development work for the WMSC.

Bringing 25-plus years of fundraising experience, Benda comes to the WMSC after seven years at Ferris State University, where she was executive director of leadership giving and relationships and then added the role of associate director of the Ferris Foundation. As a professional fundraiser, her work also includes the Helen DeVos Children's Hospital Foundation and Habitat for Humanity of Kent County. Benda is a Certified Fund Raising Executive (CFRE) and received her bachelor's degree from Northern Michigan University.
